

Science and Technology

Understanding the atomic nature of matter and how it shapes the world

Light and Electricity

- recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines
- explain objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye
- explain that we see things because light travels from light sources
- explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them
- associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit
- compare and give reasons for variations in how components function
- use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram


