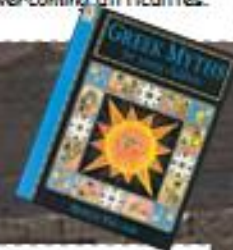
Digital Literacy: Explore a topic with research and collaboration
