The Saturday program started at 09.00 hours and lasted till 19.00 hours in the evening. Throughout the day all the committees were in session, discussing the topics on the agenda and preparing for the international summits and full Senate and Hose sessions.

Debate and moderated and unmoderated caucuses resulted in the first resolutions.





After an intense programme on Saturday, the delegates started with full sessions on Sunday morning. The House, The Senate and the International Summits I and II. The topics on the agenda were shared and more broadly discussed. First draft resolutions were either welcomed or dismissed. Delegates were forced to place their committee discussions in a broader context taking into consideration the view of other entities on similar topics. A full but very productive day followed by a "delegate formal" event in the evening.

Public speaking, negotiating, presenting viewpoints, finding compromise writing resolutions and finding support were important aspects of todays exercises.







In between the regular committee sessions and the full sessions House and Senate and International summits I and II there was also an opportunity to attend seminars. During these seminars the undergraduate Harvard students would share and lead discussion on some of their study topics or topics of interest. Delegates had to attend at least one of these sessions.

#### **Topics to select from were:**

Populism in the Modern World, The Dark Side of NGO's and Foreign Aid, The neuroscience of Politics, Artificial Intelligence and Policy, Behavioral Economics in Politics, The US Constitution and Supreme Court, Community Organization and Holding Politicians Accountable.

Some very interesting discussions took place in these seminars.
