




















Reception

In forest school, we continued to learn about the points of a compass and we explored real compasses and found it fascinating that the red needle always pointed in the same direction, even though we moved.

This week Year 2 have had a comical week learning, practising and performing Roald Dahl Revolting Rhymes Little Red Riding Hood. We analysed the text looking at the vocabulary used by different characters and how they might say the words. We performed some of the text to Year 1 who had lots of giggles with the twist at the end of the rhyme! We also started a new Maths unit Mass, Capacity and Temperature. We had great fun finding the capacity of different containers and making a bit of a mess, getting very wet!











Year 3

This week, we wrote some very exciting "Jungle Logs" about exploring a mysterious jungle after walking through a portal. Not only did we use lots of interesting vocabulary and time conjunctions, we also went back to uplevel our work to make it even better. Like proper authors, about to publish their work, we sat down with a partner editor to go over and peer assess our writing. Highlighting particularly interesting parts and bits we could improve in different colours, helped us to identify what he had done really well already, as well as our next steps. The feedback from our partner meant that we had twice the eyes and ideas and ended up with fantastic results that we can be very proud of!

We also spent some of this week working on our Science topic. As we are learning about rocks and fossils, we started reading about Mary Anning, an English palaeontologist, born in 1799, who made many important discoveries about dinosaurs. At a time when not very much was known about them at all, she kept searching for and finding bones and even whole skeletons of often unknown dinosaurs and made important conclusions from them. Unfortunately, she was not recognised for her achievements during her life, as women were not allowed to be scientists at the time and often, men took credit for her ideas. Today, we know how big her discoveries really were. We have started mind-mapping some important facts about her and will continue this work in the coming week. Please ask us about her when you see us!:)

Also in connection with our Science topic, we learned how to create the code to make a short film about an erupting volcano. First, we created the pictures of the different stages of the eruption: The volcano before, then with smoke and the lava erupting, followed by the volcano after, and finally, the cooled lava. We then had to name each picture to not lose track. Some of us have even started to build the code for the animation, telling the computer when to show which picture and how long for. In the end, we will have short, yet surely very impressive animations.



Year 4-5

Brilliant Biographies!

Year 4/5 have been very enthusiastic writers and publishers this week! After reading a biography text about an inspirational person, the children were keen to choose their own person to research. We identified the layout and features of the text and used the model biography to innovate our own. We have found out about lots of interesting people - from the past and present day - and have sketched wonderful portraits to enhance our published work. Do you recognise any of them? The children are very excited to be presenting to their parents at next week's Waxworks - we look forward to seeing you there!

EDC Pick Up 1500 or 1525-Children will be brought to the gate.


