Re: Education Review March 2023

On the 8 and 9 March 2023, I visited AFNORTH to conduct a school review of the quality of education and school provision. To do this, I visited lessons, looked at books, pupil progress data, school improvement plans and talked with children, staff, SGC and school leaders.

The British Section, AFNORTH International School provides high-quality education and care for the children. The committed leadership, teachers and support staff have created a positive vision, ethos and curriculum which ensures the children make good progress from their relative starting points. The school is focussed on ensuring that the children thrive in their learning, their personal development and good use is made of the international context of the school to enhance this educational provision.

There is a clear curriculum in place, which adheres to the objectives of the National and Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. There are well-structured whole school timetables in place and the teaching sequences are planned and delivered to ensure that learning builds on prior knowledge and skills. The teachers are dedicated to ensuring that the children flourish and achieve and skilled at ensuring that the children engage in their learning and make progress.

As with all schools, there are always further improvements and refinements to make. To achieve this, the school has effective school improvement plans in place with which they are making impressive progress. It is establishing effective and sustainable systems and processes to monitor and evaluate the curriculum coverage and the progress of the pupils across all subjects. The School Governance Committee (SGC) are supportive, are developing good systems to monitor the work of the school and this will continue to have positive impact over time.

The children were highly positive about the school, their daily lived experience, the progress they were making and they behaved impeccably during the visit.

Thank you for your ongoing support of your children in their learning journey.




