## Reception

Reception class children are learning to co-operate with others. Our tasks this week have included making obstacle courses, playing names, counting objects around school and helping each other learn in small groups.



















Year One have been enjoying making their own story map for "Brown Bear, Brown Bear What do you see?" They made a giant walk on version of the story and made their own class version of the book.

In maths the focus has been on one more and one less - finding the number that comes before or after a given number. In science we enjoyed finding out about our sense of hearing. We made giant ears and went on a listening walk around school - it was hot so they loved making splashing noises in the water! At Forest School they helped by keeping some of the paths clear. The children learnt how to use secateurs and loppers to cut away unwanted growth, they also found plenty of trees to climb too!






















Year 2 has had a very busy week learning all about different types of sentences. We've learnt about commands, statements and questions. We learnt the punctuation that goes with these sentences and applied it to our own writing. We have continued learning about living things and their processes. We have been working very hard on number lines of different scales.


















Another week has flown past in Year 3! We are continuing our great science work learning about bones and nutrition. It was fun thinking about the different skeletons of animals and noticing how they are the same or different. We wonder if we can spot bones in anything we eat at home. The tortoise and its shell and bones were really interesting, it was hard to decide if it had a backbone/spine. We also had to think hard about if it had an endoskeleton or an exoskeleton. Animals also helped us explore what prepositions were in literacy.
















## Year 4-5



This week Year 4/5 have started to explore their science unit of electricity by creating an A-Z of electrical appliances. Some of the letters were quite a challenge - especially Q and Z! We talked about how these appliances get the electricity they need and sorted them into mains electricity and battery powered using a Venn Diagram. Lots of great discussion took place!

In Maths, we have continued to develop our understanding of place value with a variety of concepts - flexible partitioning, more or less, comparing and ordering. We read an extract from The Iron Man class novel and worked on focused tasks linked to this model text.

Great work Year 4/5!

















We are making wonderful progress and completed our unit in maths about Place Value. End of unit assessments really impressed Miss Robertson and Mrs Church-Taylor! As a lead into our next writing unit where we will be writing narrative for effect, we have been studying some atmospheric poetry, The Listeners by Walter de la Mare. We have been reading to improve fluency and intonation and have had a lot of fun with this! Again, impressing our teachers! Science saw us trying to create classification keys. It was quite a challenge to come up with the correct and effective questions. We linked this with some maths where we looked at how Venn and Carroll diagrams can be used in the classification of animals. We found that Venn diagrams are effective when classifying carnivore, herbivore and omnivore.











### **Bus Passes**

## All children will receive their new bus pass for this school year in September

Dear Parent (s) / Guardian (s) of Elementary enrolled children,

AFNORTH provides a bus service for the children attending our school. The use of this bus service is a privilege and not a right. Most of our children use this bus service and AIS does its utmost to make the service safe, effective, and as punctual as possible. Our policies and procedures regarding this service can be found on the school website (afnorth-is.com). When registering your child at school or on receipt of the student bus pass for your child(ren) you should receive an information package about the busing system. When informing yourself about the conditions of the bus service you can read that our youngest children (Reception and Year 1) have a special bus pass which prevents these children to leave the bus at their bus stop if none of the parents/guardians are present (unless other arrangements have been made and communicated with the respective national office). In case nobody is present to pick up the child(ren), they will be brought back to school. The parents will be contacted, and you are expected to pick up your child.

- 1. Parents of ES children may request a yellow student card for their child(ren). This means that their children will not be left off the bus unless a parent/guardian is at the bus stop. The parent/guardian will have to be present 10 minutes prior to the scheduled bus arrival time. The bus will depart the bus stop at the indicated/scheduled time. Children carrying a yellow card will be brought back to school. Parents will be contacted (by their national section) to pick up the child(ren) from school.
- 2. For children in Years 2-6, to obtain a yellow student card, a parental request needs to be made at the beginning of the school year or upon registering the child(ren) in their national office. This card will be valid for the current school year and cannot be exchanged for a regular student card throughout the course of that year.
- 3. Without a parental request for a yellow card all children will automatically receive a regular student card. This implies that the parents have read and accept the school bus policies and procedures.
- 4. If parents frequently (three or more times) fail to meet their child(ren), carrying a yellow student card, at the bus stop, AIS will inform the parents that the use of the bus service will no longer be possible.
- 5. Parents always have the option to not use the provided bus service and provide their own transportation.
