We tried stabbing, slicing, cutting, chopping and even using tweezers to find a way to get inside and see what was waiting there! It was a challenge and a half and we relished














Reception


















Year 1 have continued enjoying the story of the gingerbread man and are getting much more confident at retelling the story. Next week we will begin making our own version of the story. We have also begun a design and technology (D&T) project - we will show you more when it is finished but so far the children have been learning how to sew a simple stitch around the edge of their canvas. We had a fabulous time at forest school despite the rain. The children enjoyed puddle jumping, exploring the mud kitchen and learning to use secateurs to cut up some sticks ready to have a little camp fire in a few weeks.




























In maths this week, Year 2 have been working on number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 and we enjoyed using numicon to help us visualise these bonds. We have continued learning about Neil Armstrong and started working on our biographies, starting with details of his early life through to his exploration of the moon, which we are finding so interesting! Continuing our 'life processes' project in science, we took a walk outside to find objects that were living, dead or had never been alive.











This week we have been working hard to finish up our work about bones and muscles. We have also started looking at the "Who Would Win?" books by Jerry Pallotta. The children have made great predictions and have been using the text to research facts about killer whales. They have identified features that link to our science work on bones and muscles. We were interested to know that a killer whale brain is 3 times the size of ours! Some of our wonderings about the animal proved true, others weren't.

In maths we have started to work on using formal methods of addition.



















Year 4-5

"In Science we are learning about electricity. It was fun this week! First we had to name electrical components on the board - crocodile clips, switch, motor, battery etc. Hazel managed to get two right! Then we got these components in lots of red boxes and had to try and light up a lightbulb. We connected the crocodile clips to the battery and made a circuit to the lightbulb. Most of us succeeded! We felt so happy when we completed the challenge. In Maths, we are working on addition and subtraction. We played a game using a place value chart and counters to build a number. Then we were given instructions to add and take away counters to find the end number. Some of us got a bit confused but at least we tried!".

Year 5 Maths

This week Year 5 have started to look at Addition and Subtraction strategies when working with large numbers. We have used different equipment to help us set out our methods to show our thinking process. We have also started to round and estimate to check our working out













We have had another very quick yet busy week.

In maths, we revisited factors, and learned how and why we might need to find Common Factors. We enjoyed representing factors of numbers by using concrete (real things like counters and Lego bricks), pictorial (drawings of arrays, and diagrams) and abstract (written lists using a systematic approach).

We had the opportunity to visit our wonderful library where Mr Berlin gave us a guided tour and reminded us about how to book out and return books.

In Science, we learned about different ways to categorise plants. One way was to categorise into vascular and non-vascular. This led to us creating an experiment to show a 'vascular' plant in action. We used our scientific skills and planned an experiment around a specific question linked to celery and food dye. We had to make sure that the activity we planned would actually answer the question we were asking (such as does position to direct light affect the plant's uptake of liquid). We had to make sure to build in 'controls' to our experiments so we could compare findings.









During periods of inclement weather please wait inside the main entrance (in the well area under the stairs or when this area is in use please wait outside the British Office). Staff will collect/deliver the children to you. There is no need to sign in

Times and locations are related to supervision and to avoid congestion outside of Sunbeams.

PE SHOES (Y2-Y6)

Please ensure your child has a separate pair of shoes for PE/Gym lessons with Coach Guest. Shoes should have non-marking soles.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Children should NOT be bringing anything to school other than essential items or requested by the teacher to support their learning. Please ensure unnecessary items do not slip into bags e.g. toys, pokemon cards.

Bus Passes

All children will receive their new bus pass for this school year in September

Dear Parent (s) / Guardian (s) of Elementary enrolled children,

AFNORTH provides a bus service for the children attending our school. The use of this bus service is a privilege and not a right. Most of our children use this bus service and AIS does its utmost to make the service safe, effective, and as punctual as possible. Our policies and procedures regarding this service can be found on the school website (afnorth-is.com). When registering your child at school or on receipt of the student bus pass for your child(ren) you should receive an information package about the busing system. When informing yourself about the conditions of the bus service you can read that our youngest children (Reception and Year 1) have a special bus pass which prevents these children to leave the bus at their bus stop if none of the parents/guardians are present (unless other arrangements have been made and communicated with the respective national office). In case nobody is present to pick up the child(ren), they will be brought back to school. The parents will be contacted, and you are expected to pick up your child.

- 1. Parents of ES children may request a yellow student card for their child(ren). This means that their children will not be left off the bus unless a parent/guardian is at the bus stop. The parent/guardian will have to be present 10 minutes prior to the scheduled bus arrival time. The bus will depart the bus stop at the indicated/scheduled time. Children carrying a yellow card will be brought back to school. Parents will be contacted (by their national section) to pick up the child(ren) from school.
- 2. For children in Years 2-6, to obtain a yellow student card, a parental request needs to be made at the beginning of the school year or upon registering the child(ren) in their national office. This card will be valid for the current school year and cannot be exchanged for a regular student card throughout the course of that year.
- 3. Without a parental request for a yellow card all children will automatically receive a regular student card. This implies that the parents have read and accept the school bus policies and procedures.
- 4. If parents frequently (three or more times) fail to meet their child(ren), carrying a yellow student card, at the bus stop, AIS will inform the parents that the use of the bus service will no longer be possible.
- 5. Parents always have the option to not use the provided bus service and provide their own transportation.
