Dear Parents,

AFNORTH is a wonderful setting to celebrate the diversity of language. This week we celebrated our linguistic differences, with the European Day of 5 Languages. The children have had opportunities to be reminded that learning a language is a step towards openness and respect for other cultures. During Monday's Assembly the children took time to consider the richness of the Power of Words. They discussed and shared their thoughts in how words can harm and how they can heal. It was impressive to hear their answers to 'How can we use our words to make people feel good and happy?' and 'What must we 20 not do with words?' The importance of respect is central.

If your child would like to draw a poster to represent how they interpret the Power of Words or the diversity of language at AFNORTH, it would be wonderful to see these at the British Office next week.

Today, it was lovely to hear the buzz of conversation as children in Years' 4 - 6 along with Grades 3-5 were introduced to the procedure for electing their **Student Council**. 




Year 2





















Year 6


Next week we will carry out two science investigations where we will further hone our scientific skills of observation and reasoning. We will also hold our voting for who will be our class representatives for Student Council.



Times and locations are related to supervision and to avoid congestion outside of Sunbeams.


