




Year 4-5

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? Walt Disney Company's streaming service, Disney+ combines entertainment from the famous animation tio itself with Pixar, Star and National Geographic, plus the Marvel and Star Wars franchises. With access to latest releases, Disney classics and original series, there's plenty of content to explore. While parents may have noted that adverts have now been introduced on some versions of the service, the platform is -unsurprisingly for a Disney product - designed to be appropriate for the whole family.

LESS SUITABLE CONTENT

De*H While Disney* is predominantly family friendly, there are some movies and shows in its library which are almed at an older audience: these may scare younger anse or contain themes or language that you'd rather your child wasn't exposed to. You could avoid such

BINGE WATCHING

growing catalogue of movies, cortoons and documentaries, Disney+ can make managing screen time difficult. This could result in children bings wetching content, distracting them from activities like homework or sacialising. Too much screen time has also been shown to negatively impact mood, sleep patterns and weight.

PHISHING EMAILS

Be especially cautious if you receive emails of text messages purporting to be from Disney*. There have been numerous reports of online numerous reports of online scammers impersonating Disney* staff in an attempt to gain access to subscribers' personal information. Disney+ states it will never email or call customers asking for their payment details, their private information or their password.

ENCROACHING adverts

Disney* has introduced a new subscription pockage – Disney* Standard with Ads – which plays commercials before movies and during shows (like many 17 channels). There are no adverts in Junior Mode, but profiles with a content rating of \$+ years will see ade appropriate for that age category. Adults who give consent will see personalised adverts based on their location and viewing history.

ACCESSING ADULTS' PROFILES

If adults don't set a PN for their profile, children could access it and ancounter content which isn't age appropriate. In the settings, Junior Mode has a taggle titled 'Kid-Proof Ecil' which requires the user to read four words (numbers, spetled out) and enter them to switch profiles. For older children who can read, though, this lan't secure enough – so using a PN for odult profiles is this isn't secure enough -PIN for adult profiles is recommended.

Advice for Parents & Carers

ADJUST CONTENT SETTINGS

When setting up an account, there's an aption to create profiles in what's called Junior Wode. This generally covers material that's suitable for children up to age 6 and is therefore fairly limited. You can give older children a wider choice of viewing by building a standard profile, then going into the settings and choosing a content rating from one of the pre-set afternatives: 6+, 8+, 12+ or 14+.

TURN OFF AUTO-PLAY

When a cartoon, show or movie finishes, Disney+ uses digarithms to identify content with similar themes, which it thinks your child will also enjoy, this suggestion will then outomatically begin to play by default. There's an option to turn off this outo-play function in the profile settings, which will encourage your child to take a brack from the screen and move on to a different activity.

ADD PIN PROTECTION

Disney+ erichies you to effectively lock profiles behind a four-digit PIN. In particular, some of the shows on the platform's Star content hub are for more criented to adults (including several hord-hitting dramas from US networks), so protecting parents' or older siblings: profiles with a PIN will help to prevent younger children stumbling ocross material which isn't intended for them.

ENJOY AS A FAMILY

When your child watches a movie or show on Disney+ for the first time, you may want to sit with them to ensure it's suitable. You could do the same when introducing them to older films that you haven't seen for years your perception of what's appropriate has very probably changed, and some of the language and attitudes in movies from your own childhood may seem quite shocking today.



Attendance

It is really important that we work together to do all we can to prioritise children's attendance at school so that they can enjoy their learning and socialising with their peers. The profile of attendance is a key priority for schools and as school has returned to normal following Covid restrictions we have been instructed to adhere strictly to school policy.



Our attendance target is 96%. To achieve this a child should have less than 7 days absence across the school year. Our current whole school attendance is 95.42%.

Reporting Absence

Unplanned Absence e.g. your child is unable to attend due to ill health

Parents must notify the school on the first day of an unplanned absence by 0900 or as soon as practically possible. Parents should email british.office@afnorth-is.com or call 045 5278241 to report an unplanned absence. Absence due to illness will be authorised unless the school has a genuine concern about the authenticity of the illness. If the authenticity of the illness is in doubt, the school may ask parents to provide medical evidence, such as a doctor's note, appointment card or other appropriate form of evidence.

Leave in Term Time

We recognise the challenges our parents face when living overseas. However, regular attendance at school is vital in helping children to achieve their full potential and get the best possible start in life.

Authorised and Unauthorised Absence

Headteachers may not grant leave of absence to pupils during term time unless they consider there to be 'exceptional circumstances'. Examples of 'exceptional circumstances' include:

- a. bereavement or serious illness of relatives.
- b. medical needs where treatment is required in the Home Country.
- c. where delivery of the Defence Mission by service parents employed in specific roles impacts on the ability to observe standard leave patterns.

The school considers each application for term-time absence individually, taking into account the specific facts, circumstances, current attendance figure, and relevant context behind the request. The headteacher may choose to discuss a request with their local Assistant Chief Education Officer (ACEO); however, a leave of absence is granted entirely at the headteacher's discretion.

Valid reasons for authorised absence include:

- a. Illness and medical/dental appointments.
- b. Religious observance where the day is exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the pupil's parents belong.
- c. Post Operational Leave.

WATER BOTTLES

Children are encouraged to bring a filled water bottle to school every day and to keep hydrated during lessons. The children have access to chilled water fountains to top up their bottles. Children should take their bottle home each night to be washed. permitted. Cans and bottles of carbonated drinks, including energy drinks, are not permitted in school.
